Finding the glory of the Lord all around us is easy. Many years back, David was doing this. I would like to use words from Psalm today to emphasize this important gratitude in our hearts. How thankful we are to the Heavenly Father, how He made us, that we can see, that we can perceive, we can feel how wonderful are his works, and we all know it well.

Just like the Psalmist said, I give thee thanks to Thee, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are Thy works, and my soul knows it well.

This when our eyes behold Thy word, We read Thy name in fairest lines in Christ when all things are complete, the things in earth and things in heaven, the heavens and earth shall be replete with Thy high praises ever given by faith we see thy glory now we read thy wisdom, love and grace in praise and adoration Bow and long to see thy glorious face Called Lord by Thee to the highest place, to presence of Thy glory bright. O, for such condescending grace how can we speak Thy praise aright?

Words express the inward feelings of David and I believe with our hearts as well as we gather for conventions. As we rejoice, having fellowship with the brethren, so think about the meaning of these words as you hear the rendition which I was able to locate, and you're going to notice that this rendition of the hymn was done by those who are among you today at the convention, because the recording of this hymn is in Polish, and it was done many years back in Krakow. In the pictures which you saw, millions and billions of stars and galaxies, the wonderful works of our Heavenly Father come to full light.

But that's not the only place where we can see this glory. Yes, when we consider the heavens, the moon and the stars, we see it clearly. But also notice the last statement in this quote.

You have crowned him with glory and honor. There is a wonderful universe, not visible to a naked eye of a human, which is equally vast and unmeasured, which I would like to bring to your attention. This is the wonderful creation of man. You formed my inmost being, David wrote in Psalm 139, you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.

Marvelous are your works, and I know this very well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in secret. When I was woven together in the depths of the earth, your eyes saw my unformed body and all my days were written in your book and ordained for me before one of them came to be. Did you notice we praised our heavenly Father for he wonderfully made us all. Marvelous are his works and we know this very well.

In all the pictures which I used to Visualize the hymn 283, the Glory of the Lord. In every sequence, in every verse, there was one slide which I hope you noticed was not a galaxy, but it looked like galaxy. That was a puzzle. I hope you know what it is and if so, maybe you will tell me later. But right now I want to show you one more time this vast unmeasured universe, or really two universes which exist by showing you the following presentation which explains the ways of the Lord.

This is a nerve cell or neuron. This neuron is shown 20,000 times larger. As in reality, at this tremendous magnification, a hair would be six feet thick. These incredible organic chips function through electric signals called action potentials. They control nearly everything we do from thinking to moving muscles, from sensing to hearing and even watching this video.

SAM the thin extensions at the top of the neuron are called dendrites. These dendrites receive signals from other neurons. As long as inhibiting blue signals dominate, the neuron will remain

silent. But as soon as the activating red signals dominate, an electric pulse pulse is sent through the thick lower tube of the neuron. This tube is called the axon of the neuron.

Neurons are not alone. The human brain contains 100 billion neurons.

If we were to walk through a single human brain at this point pace, it would take over 300 years just to take a glimpse at all the neurons.

Sam we are now zooming in up to a magnification of 20 million times. At this scale, a hair would be over a mile thick.

Each neuron contains billions and billions of proteins. These proteins are tiny little machines, each designed to do a specific job foreign.

The glory of the Lord can be seen in galaxies and stars in human body and the wonderfully created brains which are in charge of our thinking.

Thinking is one of the most important thing which we were given. This is what differentiates humans from other wonderful creatures and animals of this world.

Thinking, reading, hearing the stories of the ancient of days constitutes learning which we Value so much. Remember the words of our take my yoke upon you and learn of me. For I am meek and lowly in heart, and ye shall find rest unto your soul. Learn of me. Brethren, have you ever considered how important learning in our lives is?

This is a wonderful, glorious things our Heavenly Father gave us. So think for a moment. What is learning? How do you learn? When do you know that you learned something?

Let me propose that a good definition of what learning is is to change the way you think. Now, if you pause for a moment and reflect upon this, the change in thinking means that we are the only creature in the universe which is capable of self modification. You know what that means? That every time you come to a meeting, you hear the scripture, you hear a discussion, you learn something, you change your thinking, you become a different person. None other creature in the universe can do that.

You can, because the glory of the Lord. This possibility was given unto us, and as a man thinks in his heart, so he is.

There are many things we can talk about, but our time is almost past.

What I would like to leave you with is this thought which relates to the fact that we can think, we can understand, we can modify our thinking, we can leave the fellowship. The convention changed people because we learned something and became different.

There are many pitfalls in our thinking, and tomorrow, Lord willing, we are going to talk about some of them.

But today I would like to leave you with this thought which is, as a man thinks in his heart, so he is, and I would like to encourage you today during the fellowship, during the dinner time, and tomorrow, think about one, maybe two things which you understood, which are different, you did not know before, so that you can leave the hospitable place of Vancouver, British Columbia, a
